Masters Learn to Row Coach Northampton Community Rowing, Northampton, MA

Schedule: Part-time, seasonal

Salary: Commensurate with experience within the range of \$15 - \$25 an hour

Organizational Description:

Northampton Community Rowing (NCR), a premiere rowing club in western Massachusetts is accepting applications for an assistant crew coach for the fall 2022 season and beyond.

NCR maintains a roster of 70 Junior and Master rowers and is located on the grounds of the Connecticut River Greenway Riverfront Park in downtown Northampton, Massachusetts. NCR is a community-based and volunteer-driven organization, dedicated to enhancing the sport of rowing for youth and adults throughout the Pioneer Valley by creating an environment that challenges, inspires teamwork, sportsmanship, athleticism and camaraderie through competitive and recreational opportunities. NCR boasts a year-round community program that serves a strong youth and adult rowing program.

Northampton Community Rowing's mission is to:

- Develop sportsmanship, fitness, rowing skills, teamwork, friendship, cooperation and enjoyment for adults through safe and challenging rowing activities.
- Enable and promote athletic and personal achievement for adult and youth rowers as team members and individuals.
- Develop the leadership skills of young people and adults, and the organizational capacity to endure and thrive.

- Promote stewardship of the Connecticut River as a recreational and environmental resource.
- Encourage the development of facilities, river access, and programs that benefit community rowing activities.

Job Description

The Adult Learn to Row coach is chiefly responsible to provide the first impression for new participants to the sport of rowing and Northampton Community Rowing. The learn to row program is the first step for new rowers to develop the basics of the rowing stroke, before they join the club novice team.

Multiple part-time/hourly positions could be combined or separate depending on the candidate's ability, experience and schedule.

Specific responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Work collaboratively with the Head Coach and coaching staff to develop and present consistent leadership
- Develop and implement a training plan that addresses the physical, mental, and technical development of rowers
- Foster a culture of respect, safety, empowerment and sportsmanship
- Supervision and instruction of rowers during all practice activities
- Supervision and instruction of rowers during all competitions
- Ability to create a safe, exciting and competitive training environment
- Help maintain equipment, equipment inventories, and prioritize equipment needs
- Communicate well with all stakeholders (staff, board members, athletes, parents, community members)
- Self-motivated, creative problem-solving skills and willingness to complete any task

Requirements for the position of the Adult Learn to Row Coach include:

• Strong understanding of rowing technique, and ability to communicate effectively and creatively to those who are new to the sport.

- Availability for all practices
- Successful completion of a criminal background check (if interacting with junior participants)
- CPR & First Aid certification and/or training is required within one month of hire
- Possess a driving license and safesport certificates (can all be obtained before 1st day)
- Compliance with all NCR and USRowing policies and procedures

Physical Qualifications:

- Standing and / or sitting for long periods of time.
- Regularly required to listen, direct, and speak.
- Position requiring mobility, including bending, lifting (up to 50 lbs.), pushing, walking.
- Use of legs, arms, hands and fingers to manipulate rowing equipment, docks and boats motors, computers and office equipment.

Working Environment:

- The position may require working with high levels of noise and extreme temperatures at times.
- The environment may be stressful and hectic at times with frequent interruptions.
- The employee will work outdoors (may include inclement weather) during the rowing season.
